- The Project respects the rights, dignity and worth of every person and will treat everyone equally within the context of their sport, regardless of age, ability, gender, race, ethnicity, religious belief, sexuality or social/economic status.
- The Project is committed to everyone having the right to enjoy their sport in an environment free from threat of intimidation, harassment and abuse.
- All Project members have a responsibility to oppose discriminatory behaviour and promote equality of opportunity.
- The Project will deal with any incidence of discriminatory behaviour seriously, according to the Project's disciplinary procedures.
